



## July 2021 Edition

Reflecting back, exactly one year ago, when we were navigating the stormy seas of the pandemic, we had high expectations of returning and even decided to return to worship with a concrete plan last July. However, all of a sudden, our church and hundreds of others had to slam on the brakes. Despite our hopes and best made plans, due to the unanticipated spike of COVID-19 during the summer, we continued with online worship until we reconvened in November. Let me share some noticeable changes in worship that the church board has agreed to *hit the gas* on as we move forward as well as acknowledge a few ways we are keeping the cruise on at this time:

- The first obvious change you will notice is that bulletins will be handed out to everyone.
- Upon entering the sanctuary, you will quickly notice that we are more fully utilizing our project system/screens to enhance worship from announcements, Scripture, Lord's Prayer, and etc.
- Perhaps the most exciting news is that the FGCU students will direct and invite the entire congregation to join with them in singing the classic and beloved hymns from the *Chalice Hymnal*.
- I would argue the most meaningful change is we will return to taking communion together during worship. At this time, we will not pass out any plates but the prepackaged communion kits will be located in the pews. After the words of institution worshippers will be invited to pick up a communion kit, take both the bread and juice together, and then place the empty cup back in the pew rack. After worship the deacons will pick up used kits and replace them.
- Hymnals and communion kits will be the only items in the pew racks. The offering plates will remain in the narthex and envelopes will be available for tithes and offerings.
- Feel free to use any door now, including the side doors, to enter/exit the sanctuary.
- At this time, we will not have an official greeting time at the beginning of worship but have plans to resume this important element of worship in the future.
- We *encourage* all non-vaccinated worshippers to wear a mask.
- Finally, if you are still unable to attend worship or a seasonal member trying to stay better connected, the board agreed to continue streaming worship.

While we are not fully where we left off before the pandemic, I hope you feel even more "back at home" when you arrive this Sunday or participate online. Additionally, let us continue to be thankful for new additions to worship from stellar recorded preludes of Lauryn K., other talented vocalists leading special music, and the online stream. Faithful Art N. raised his hand during the board meeting on Sunday and sincerely stated "I just miss singing." Well, my friend, we are back, moving forward and pressing down on the pedal!
