We remember that Christ is the King of the World and Jesus is the Lord of our lives. Pam Williams will be baptized this Sunday, and we will make this open for anyone else to come forward and to remember their baptism on Sunday, November 26. I know many people will be out of town or traveling during the Thanksgiving weekend. However, if you are in worship, you are welcome to come forward and to be marked by the sign of the cross with water as you remember your baptism. That is, you will have a chance to confirm your faith and remember that Christ is the Lord of your life in this life and the life to come.

Finally, I want to reiterate one more time that if you or someone else struggles throughout the holiday season there are plenty of beneficial resources.
